"And Theeey'rrre Off!!"...

On Saturday, May 4th. this shout will be heard thundered once again by Larry Collmus, the Voice of the Kentucky Derby.

As the starting gate releases the prepped and eager three-year-old Thoroughbreds from their stalls to run the first race of the 2019 Triple Crown series. The Derbyknown as "The Run for the Roses®" and "the most exciting two minutes in sports"—celebrates its 145th anniversary run this year.

The Kentucky Derby had its first run of 1.5 miles on May 17, 1875 before an enthusiastic crowd of ten thousand spectators. The first winning horse, Aristides, and his iockey. Oliver Lewis, won a purse of \$2,850 (equal to nearly \$66 thousand in 2018). The winning time was 2:37.75 minutes.

In 1896, the race distance was reduced to its present 1.25 miles as a safer distance for the young horses. To this day, Secretariat, the famed winning horse of 1973, still holds the Derby record finish at 1:59 2/5 minutes.

Founded by Meriwether Lewis Clark, Jr., grandson of the legendary exploration duo Lewis and Clark. Meriwether became obsessed with thorough-

bred racing while honeymooning in Europe in 1872. Taking in the Epsom Derby in London and keeping company with members of the French Jockey Club, which had developed the popular Grand Prix de Paris Longchamps, Meriwether was determined to create a similar championship racing spectacular in the States.

Returning to his home in Kentucky, Clark formally organized a group of local racing fans and the Louisville Jockey Club was birthed. The Club campaigned for funds to build a permanent local racetrack. With land donated by his uncles, John and Henry Churchill, Meriwether's dream was realized. Within two years of Meriwether's return from abroad, the Louisville Racing Track—later named Churchill Downs in honor of his uncles—held its first race.

The Derby is replete with traditions: draping the winning horse with the Derby's official Red Rose Garland; singing Stephen Foster's *My Old Kentucky Home*; wearing extreme and fanciful headgear for the Event and enjoying Mint Julep cocktails made of Kentucky Bourbon, mint, sugar and water served in a silver or pewter cup.

In the 19th century, horseracing was considered seedy business centered around drinking and gambling. Clark invited people of society to come to the racetrack, setting the dress code as "full morning dress" to give the sport an air of respectability. This accounts for the hats.

Today, The Derby is a true icon of Americana. It boasts annual live crowds of 150,000 for the racing Thoroughbreds.



This year's race anticipates 20 million TV viewers and multi-millions more watching via internet streaming. The 2019 winning purse is the largest ever, with a guaranteed \$3 million to be awarded the winner of America's greatest horse race.
